

Care at home after a **Mammoplasty Plastic Surgery**

A breast reduction surgery aims to reduce the overall size of the breasts. This is achieved by removing tissue, skin and fat from the breasts to relieve patients from discomfort and obtain a more desirable appearance. A breast reduction surgery also involves repositioning the nipple and reducing the size of the areola. This following information will help ensure your child has a safe recovery after leaving the hospital.

Caring for your surgical site

- A compression dressing will be in place. This dressing will have gauze padding covered with Hypafix tape (an adhesive cover). You will leave this dressing on until your follow up appointment.
- You may notice some blood or fluid staining your dressing once you leave the hospital, this can be normal. Should you have significant increase in pain or breast size on one side then it is important to let our team know (see below for further details).
- At your surgeon's discretion, you may need to buy a post-surgical bra for the day of your first dressing change (wireless, clasping in front or back).

Pain Management

You will be uncomfortable during the first few days following your surgery. This is normal. It is very important that you are resting and giving your body time to heal.

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- Pain that does not lessen even after giving your child the prescribed medications or increase in breast size on one side.
- A fever of 38.5°C (101°F) or higher.
- Increased redness and swelling around the incision.
- Increasing drainage or bleeding through the dressing.
